Retired Faculty and Staff Centennial Scholarship
Fair Market Value as of January 31, 2017: \$138,844

This Fair Market Value (FMV) report is intended to keep you abreast of the status of the **Cal Poly Retired Faculty and Staff Centennial Scholarship** endowment during the year. The current FMV includes the annual payout withdrawal for 2016-17, as well as the ebb and flow of investment markets throughout the year.

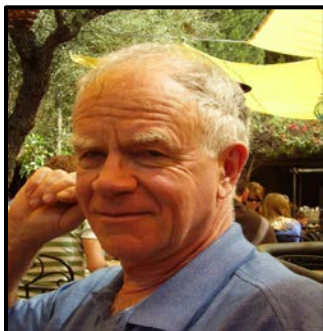
Two years ago, with the assistance of staff in the Financial Aid Office and the Scholarships and Trust and Endowment Offices, the annual payout for the Centennial Scholarship was restructured to provide for a second \$3,000 scholarship every third year. Presently, the annual withdrawal from the endowment is \$4,000, with \$3,000 going to the current scholarship and the remaining \$1,000 going to a holding account for RFS. At the three-year point, enough funding has accumulated to award the second \$3,000 scholarship, in addition to the original annual award. This will continue as long as the endowment maintains a FMV that will support this structure. The two recipients for the 2016-2017 academic year are Sofia Ilic from the College of Architecture and Environmental Design, and Isabelle Barnes from the College of Agriculture, Food, and Environmental Sciences. We congratulate Sofia and Isabelle on their awards and hope to introduce them at this year's June Jubilee.

Please keep in mind your designated contributions and lifetime membership fees go directly into the endowment's Principal balance and provide the foundation for continued scholarship funding. Thank you to all who continue to support this effort.

We are pleased to announce that Glen will continue in a new role as Club Past President while the new Club President and Vice President, Joe Grimes and Bill Kellogg, will begin their term on July 1, 2017.

Meet Incoming President Joe Grimes



Before arriving at Cal Poly in the fall of 1972, Joe Grimes taught high school and coached the golf team, worked professionally as a civil engineer, and was a full-time lecturer at Iowa State University while working there on his PhD. At Cal Poly, Joe was a professor of computer science and engineering, director of campus computing, and director of computer engineering while founding and managing the faculty development center.

He also served on two campus-wide WASC accreditation teams, chaired the campus instructional advisory committee on computing, served as faculty development representative on the California State University Instructional Computing Advisory Committee, and participated in ABET accreditation for the Computer Engineering Program. Joe was personally responsible for grants to Cal Poly in excess of \$6.25 million, and he worked with others to secure additional grants in excess of \$2.5 million.

Though now retired, Joe is currently a consultant to the Cal Poly Center for Teaching, Learning and Technology, where he works primarily with international faculty members.

Outside of his work at Cal Poly, Joe has remained incredibly busy by serving as the chair of his church's financial council as well as on the Board of Directors for Softec, where he teaches high school computer science and mathematics, and is the Director of the AYSO Board and coaches and referees soccer. Above all else, however, Joe places his greatest emphasis on his family.

Meet Incoming Vice President for Programs Bill Kellogg



Bill Kellogg joined the Cal Poly faculty in the Agricultural Education and Communication Department in the fall of 1983. He retired from Cal Poly in September 2015 after 32 years of services to the university, teaching both undergraduate and graduate courses while also serving as an educator helping to prepare the next generation of high school agriculture teachers.

During his tenure, Bill also taught courses in the Bioresource and Agricultural Engineering Department and was a content educator in the College of Education. Serving on numerous college and university-wide committees, Bill was a Director for the Cal Poly Foundation (now the Cal Poly Corporation) for 15 years and sat on the Foundation's/Corporation's Investment Committee for 18 years. In his last six years at Cal Poly, Bill served as Department Head in the Agricultural Education and Communication Department.

Bill has been married to his wife, Debbie, for 40 years and has three children and six grandchildren.

Friends in Passing

DAVID CONN (CRP): David spent more than a decade as Cal Poly's Vice Provost for Academic Programs and Undergraduate Education. David also assisted in the review of the CAED college Retention, Promotion and Tenure guidelines, and led faculty teams in the preparation of the State of California multi-hazard mitigation plan. As a professor of City and Regional Planning, he taught environmental planning. David was known to always speak from the heart and possessed a keen wit that made each conversation with him a pleasant experience. He passed away in March 2017.

GERARD GENTILUCCI (Facilities): After 17 years in the Facilities Services, Gerard retired as Building Trades Supervisor. His family and friends celebrated his life after his passing in January 2017.

THOMAS SCHUMANN (Math & Science): Thomas taught physics and math at Cal Poly for over 30 years. He is remembered by his family and friends for both his inward and outward calmness. Thomas moved to Downieville in 2012 where he was deeply involved with community services until his death in February 2017.

HARRY WOLF (Engineering): Harry is remembered for jump starting Cal Poly's electrical engineering program. He taught navigation, physics and electrical engineering for 31 years and was an avid ham radio operator. His family noted that Harry lived from the "horse and buggy age into the space age." He passed away shortly before his 108th birthday in January 2017.

ARTHUR JOHN YOUNG (Facilities): After retirement as chief engineer at Cal Poly in 1985, Arthur travelled widely with his wife. The couple also operated an art gallery and gift shop in Cayucos. Arthur died in February 2017.
